### Rapport Based Relating – Child Whispering Workshop with Lee Trew

**24-26 March 2017 – Kindleshill School (This is a weekend workshop for adults only)**

Rapport Based Relating will open your eyes to how many of our society's ways of interacting with kids just don't work, and why. Lee Trew will show you a simple way that does, and run through a variety of active processes to embody these techniques. He is not interested in throwing theories at you; he just wants to help you transform your family dynamics, so everyone gets their needs met. This stuff works.

Lee Trew is a psychotherapist and experienced group facilitator, working for many years with teenage rites of passage, men's groups, and mixed group facilitation. He teaches bushcraft and primitive living skills. Lee is an inspirational speaker and storyteller with a talent for distilling complicated concepts down their essence, making them easy to understand and digest.

Lee developed Rapport Based Relating as an answer to the traditional 'shout and shame' he saw in institutions working with children. His model breaks down the barriers for parents and teachers to have meaningful relationships with kids. He has helped hundreds of families move into deeper, more meaningful connection.
